1. Please enter all information in the booking form. Before 15 days prior to departure, the full amount of the tour fee should be paid.
2. Passport must be valid for a minimum of 6 months from the day of arrival at your destination.
3. Please read the terms & conditions to understand what is and is not included in the price.

TOUR FAIR INCLUDES

- (1) 4-star hotel accommodation, based on shared twin room with private facilities
 - Continental breakfast included (Coffee/Tea, Juice, Bread and Jam)
 - European hotels may be modest in size, and not providing complimentary bath toiletries. Please bring your own toiletries.
 - Due to moderate European climate, hotels may not be equipped with standard air conditioning.
- (2) Sightseeing and orientation tours on modern 5-9 seats air-conditioned business van with professional English speaking driver-guide service.

TOUR FEES EXCLUDE

- (1) Travel insurance, travel document and visa fees.
 - (2) Optional on-tour activities and entrance tickets to attractions. (please refer to Optional On-Tour Activities list)
 - (3) Service gratuity for the driver-guide at € 10 / £ 10 per passenger per day. (payable for adult and child)
 - (4) International or connecting flight tickets and excess luggage.
 - (5) Meals (lunch, dinner and drinks), personal overheads such as drinks, laundry, internet, phone calls, damage cost in hotels and etc.
 - (6) goEUgo will accept no responsibility for loss of personal possessions or financial loss due to accident, delay, weather, strike or causes beyond control.
 - (7) Accommodation Tax, This fee will be paid by guests upon hotel check-in, according to the local tax rate of each city.
4. Booking Time: Bookings must be made at least 15 days in advance. If the booking is made less than 15 days before the departure date, all payments must be made at the time of registration.

5. CANCELLATIONS, RESCHEDULE AND REFUNDS

- Please read carefully the cancellation and refund policy.
 - If you cancel your tour for any reason including medical or personal reasons, the following cancellation/refund charges will apply:
 - 16 days prior departure – No extra cost for changes to prior or later departure. In case of cancellation - Full refund
 - 15-08 days prior departure – 50% of invoice will be deducted for cancellation and rescheduling
 - Less than 7 days prior departure – NO REFUND will be given for cancellation and rescheduling
6. When a group consists of two adults and one child, if the child is between 2 and 11 years old, they will be charged at the children's rate. The child will not be provided with a separate bed and must share a room with the two adults. If the group consists of two adults and two children, the price will be calculated as if for four adults. The room arrangement will have one adult and one child per room, with the children occupying a bed and charged at the adult rate.
 7. For minors under 18, pregnant women, or seniors (80+), they must be accompanied by at least one adult relative or friend (under 75) in order for their participation to be accepted. Note: Participants who are pregnant or seniors (70+) must sign a "Participant Commitment and Waiver of Liability" (support online signature) at the time of registration for mutual protection. We also recommend that pregnant women or seniors purchase appropriate insurance products before joining the tour.
 8. goEUgo reserves the right to accept or reject registrations without providing any reason or explanation.
 9. When registering, please provide an accurate email address and mobile phone number to ensure smooth communication for future replies and confirmation messages.
 10. Please book your flight tickets only after received our confirmation.
 11. Tour Voucher contains important information such as contact numbers of tour guides (phone number, WeChat and WhatsApp QR code) and emergency phone number. Please have the digital version or print out a hard copy with you during the tour for verification purposes.

2. The transportation and hotels used by our company, such as airplanes, ships, trains, or business vans, have different safety and liability regulations regarding passenger safety and lost luggage. In cases of lost luggage, accidents, or property loss, the rules set by these organizations will be the basis for resolution, and our company will not be responsible or liable in any way.
3. In the case of special circumstances such as severe weather, strikes, typhoon impacts, lost documents, full hotel capacity, flight cancellations or delays, political unrest, epidemics, or other sudden uncontrollable events requiring changes or cancellations of the itinerary, accommodations, or transportation, goEUgo reserves the right to make decisions based on the situation. TOUR RULES

1. The driver-guide will proactively contact the guests who participating in the tour before 21:00 (EU local time) the day before departure. If you fail to be contacted, please call the contact number listed of the driver-guide on the Tour Voucher.
2. Each participant is allowed to bring one big and one small luggage on board (Big luggage weight below 30kg and must be no larger than 28 inches; carry-on/small luggage must be no larger than 20 inches). If passenger brings more than one big and one small luggage (given that there is space available to store) each additional piece of luggage will be charged €5/ day (£5/ day for purple line). Availability to accommodate extra luggages cannot be guaranteed.
3. Most attractions points in Europe cannot be reached directly by business van, and will require participants to travel on foot. If the participants are of limited mobility, this tour may not be suitable for you. We cannot offer compensation or refunds for missed attractions, so please think twice before joining the tour. Once the booking is completed, it also means accepting the terms and conditions set by the tour operator.
4. Driver-guide are your hosts during the tour. They will help you explore and make the most of your time. Their passion for travel and local knowledge will enrich your holiday experience. Gratuity is paid directly to driver-guide when the tour is over. We have set a obligatory tip of € 10 / £ 10 per passenger per day during your tour. Please prepare cash as a token of your appreciation.
5. Present your Tour Voucher (Printed or digital) to the driver-guide when you board the coach. goEUgo cannot allow delays by a single passenger or group. A participant's negligence and late arrival can result in missed connections for other passengers. In case of emergencies, please call our emergency numbers as printed on your Booking Voucher.
6. Participants are responsible for carrying valid travel documents (passport) and visas, with a validity period of no less than six months from the departure date. In any situation or for any reason, if entry is refused by immigration (customs), our company will not be held responsible. All losses incurred will be the sole responsibility of the participant, and no refund of the tour fees will be provided.
7. Please avoid bringing valuables and precious jewellery. Keep all your valuable personal belongings with you, this includes passport and money. The tour company, driver and the tour manager will not be responsible for any losses incurred.
8. All tour participants must abide by the laws of the countries they visit. It is strictly prohibited to carry contraband or illegal goods for profit. Smoking is strictly forbidden in all public spaces and indoor areas across Europe, including hotel rooms, with fines reaching up to thousands of euros. We kindly remind participants to comply with these regulations. In recent years, some well-known European buildings (tourist sites) have prohibited visitors from sitting on the ground to rest or eat. Day 1 | Amsterdam → Apeldoorn → Utrecht → Eindhoven (240 km)

In the morning, our driver-guide will meet you at the pre-arranged time and location to begin the journey!

Apeldoorn – known for forests and strong ties to the Dutch royal family.

- **Het Loo Palace:** A former summer residence of the Dutch royal family, often called the “Versailles of the Netherlands.” Visit royal rooms to learn about court life, history, furniture and décor. The Baroque palace gardens feature elegant fountains and sculptures, reminiscent of Versailles.
- **Apenheul Primate Park:** The world’s first zoo where monkeys roam freely. Squirrel monkeys and lemurs may jump around nearby, while larger primates such as gorillas live in natural habitats that can be viewed across water or barriers; listen to keeper talks during feeding times.

Utrecht – a vibrant old university city and hometown of Miffy creator Dick Bruna.

- **Miffy Museum:** Designed to spark children’s imagination through play and exploration. Each gallery represents a theme in the Miffy world, such as Miffy’s home, the zoo, a hospital or transport. Next door, the Centraal Museum features Dick Bruna’s original studio, displaying his furniture, paintings and design sketches.
- **Dom Tower:** The city’s signature landmark and the tallest church tower in the Netherlands. Climb up for panoramic views. After a five-year restoration, it was fully reopened by the end of 2024.
- **Museum Speelklok:** Known as the “Palace of Joy,” one of the world’s richest collections of self-playing instruments. Located in a beautiful former church, it features tiny music boxes, giant street organs and other automatic instruments.
- **Railway Museum:** Housed in a restored old railway station, featuring historic steam locomotives, luxurious royal carriages and trains from different eras.

Day 2 | Eindhoven → Nuenen → Maastricht (80 km)

Eindhoven – the Netherlands’ innovation, design and tech hub; often ranked among Europe’s leading tech cities.

- Philips Museum: Located in the original factory where founder Gerard Philips produced the first incandescent light bulbs in 1891. This interactive museum tells how Philips grew from a small workshop into a global electronics giant, showcasing products from light bulbs, radios and TVs to modern healthcare technologies.
- Van Abbemuseum: A world-renowned modern and contemporary art museum, with works by Picasso, Kandinsky, Chagall and more.
- DAF Museum: Showcasing the rich history of Dutch truck and car manufacturer DAF, with vehicles spanning from its founding in 1928 to the present day.
- Evoluon: Eindhoven’s iconic UFO-shaped building, constructed by Philips in 1966 as a science and technology museum to celebrate the company’s 75th anniversary; its avant-garde design quickly made it a city landmark.

Nuenen – where Van Gogh lived and created around a quarter of his works, including The Potato Eaters.

- Vincentre (Van Gogh Village Museum): A key place to learn about Van Gogh’s important years in Nuenen (1883-1885), when he painted The Potato Eaters. It is also the starting point for Nuenen’s “open-air museum” route, visiting 24 Van Gogh-related sites, including his parents’ home, the church and pastoral landscapes.
- Van Gogh–Roosegaarde Cycle Path: A 600-metre bike path inlaid with thousands of glowing stones, inspired by Van Gogh’s Starry Night. About 50,000 stones with a special photoluminescent coating combine artistic beauty with eco-technology.

Day 3 | Maastricht → Designer Outlet Roermond → Arnhem (160 km)

Maastricht – one of the Netherlands’ oldest cities; the Maastricht Treaty (1992) marked the birth of the European Union.

- Dominicanen Bookstore: a 13th-century Gothic church transformed into a stunning cultural space.
- Maastricht University: founded in 1976; renowned for law, medicine, economics and European studies.
- St. Servatius Bridge: regarded as the Netherlands’ oldest bridge (rebuilt after WWII).
- Hell’s Gate: The oldest surviving defensive city gate in the Netherlands, with a history dating back to 1229.
- Helpoort & the underground caves: the oldest surviving city gate (1229) and a vast limestone labyrinth used for shelter and storage.

Roermond – home to one of Europe’s largest designer outlets with an exceptional mix of international brands.

- 200+ stores: fashion, sports and home brands with year-round discounts (often up to 70%). Popular names include Prada, Gucci, Burberry, Armani, Michael Kors, Nike, Adidas and more.

Day 4 | Arnhem → De Hoge Veluwe National Park → Giethoorn → Amsterdam (220 km)

De Hoge Veluwe National Park – one of the Netherlands’ largest nature reserves, blending wildlife, art and modern architecture.

- Kröller-Müller Museum: the world’s second-largest Van Gogh collection (about 90 paintings & 180 drawings). Must-sees include works like The Potato Eaters and Café Terrace at Night (subject to exhibition). Sculpture Garden: one of Europe’s largest outdoor sculpture parks featuring masters such as Rodin and Picasso.
- St. Hubertus Hunting Lodge: a landmark by architect Hendrik Petrus Berlage, with a distinctive V-shaped design and lookout tower.

Giethoorn – an eco-friendly fairytale village of winding canals and 170+ wooden bridges, known as the “Venice of the North”.

- Giethoorn boat cruise (about 1 hour): glide through the main canals and lake area with commentary from an experienced captain.
- Giethoorn Museum: learn the village’s history—peat digging, traditional boats, old farmhouses and daily life artefacts.

Arrive back in Amsterdam in the evening. Our driver-guide will drop you off at the pre-arranged location—tour ends.

Daily Itinerary

Day 1: Paris → Giverny → Rouen → Étretat → Le Havre (270 km)

In the morning, meet your driver-guide at the scheduled time and location, and begin the journey.

Giverny — home of Impressionist master Claude Monet and a cradle of Impressionist art.

- **Monet's House & Gardens:** Monet created countless masterpieces here. The house displays a rich collection of Japanese ukiyo-e prints. Monet once said, "My garden is my most beautiful work." The gardens are divided into the Normandy garden and the water garden. Across the road, the pond is filled with water lilies, with the famous Japanese bridge, willow trees and bamboo — the real-life scene behind his iconic Water Lilies series.

Rouen — the medieval capital of Normandy, known as the "City of a Hundred Spires".

- **Rouen Cathedral:** A landmark of Normandy famed for its magnificent Gothic façade and its link to Monet. Built over centuries, it features France's tallest cast-iron spire (151 m), exquisite Gothic carvings, and stained-glass windows. Monet painted over 30 works of the cathedral's west front from across the square.

Étretat — a seaside town in Normandy renowned for its white cliffs and natural arches.

- **Elephant Rock & the Needle:** Nature's masterpiece that has inspired artists such as Monet and Victor Hugo for centuries. Elephant Rock was shaped by waves eroding the cliff, resembling an elephant dipping its trunk into the sea. Nearby, the Needle is a solitary limestone pillar rising about 70 m from the water.

Day 2: Le Havre → Omaha Beach → Caen (210 km)

Le Havre — an important port city in Normandy, listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

- Museum of Modern Art (MuMa): Set by the coast with abundant natural light, it houses an impressive collection of Impressionist and modern works — one of France’s most important art museums.
- The Hanging Gardens: A botanical park within a former military fort, offering panoramic views over the Seine estuary and the city.
- Le Havre Beach: A long pebble beach loved by locals and visitors — perfect for a relaxed stroll and sunset views.

Omaha Beach — one of the most historically significant sites of the WWII Normandy landings.

- Omaha Beach Memorial Museum: Commemorating the Allied soldiers who fell here on D-Day (6 June 1944) at the area known as “Bloody Omaha”. The museum displays extensive artifacts, personal items, uniforms, weapons, military vehicles (including tanks and landing craft), and historical documents related to the Normandy landings.

Caen — the stronghold of William the Conqueror and a key witness to Normandy’s wartime history.

- Caen Castle: Built around 1060 by William the Conqueror, once residence of the Dukes of Normandy and Kings of England. The complex includes the Normandy Museum, a fine arts museum and the Church of St George, and offers sweeping views over Caen.
- Abbey of Men: Commissioned by William I in the late 11th century, a masterpiece of Romanesque and Gothic architecture. The Church of St-Étienne houses William’s tomb.
- Abbey of Women: Founded by Queen Matilda, William’s wife. The Church of the Holy Trinity is a fine example of Norman architecture and contains Matilda’s tomb.
- Vaugueux District: A lively quarter with medieval Caen stone houses, lined with restaurants, cafés and bars — ideal for soaking up the local atmosphere.

Day 3: Caen → Mont Saint-Michel → Saint-Malo (190 km)

{Mont Saint-Michel — hailed as the “Wonder of the Western World”, inscribed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1979. It is famous for dramatic tides: at high tide it becomes a true “island in the sea”; at low tide, vast sandbanks appear and visitors can walk across the bay.}

- Mont Saint-Michel Abbey & Church: The abbey is the heart of the mount — an architectural and artistic feat steeped in legend. In 708 AD, Bishop Aubert of Avranches reportedly received three visions from Archangel Michael instructing him to build a church here. After the third apparition, a mark was left on the bishop’s skull as proof of the miracle. The relic is still preserved in Avranches today.

Saint-Malo — a famed corsair city in Brittany, known for its impressive ramparts and fortifications.

- Saint-Malo Ramparts: The must-see highlight. Walk along the walls encircling the old town for sweeping views of the coastline, rooftops, and nearby islands.
- Grand Bé & Petit Bé: Two tidal islets just off Saint-Malo, reachable on foot at low tide.
- Old Town: Inside the walls lies Saint-Malo’s historic heart — charming cobbled lanes, stone buildings, and bustling shops and restaurants, rich with the spirit of a “pirate city”.

Day 4: Saint-Malo → Le Mans → Paris (400 km)

Le Mans — a city rich in history and culture, world-famous for the Le Mans 24 Hours endurance race.

- Plantagenet Old Town: Encircled by Roman-era walls. Stroll along the ramparts for views over the Sarthe River; inside, narrow winding cobbled streets form a charming maze.

- Cathedral of Saint Julian: A landmark in the center of the old town. Its architecture blends Romanesque and Gothic styles, adding a grand religious presence to the district.
- 24 Hours of Le Mans Museum: Located near the entrance of the Bugatti Circuit. Exhibits cover the race’s evolution since 1923, technological innovations, legendary drivers and teams, and a rich collection of cars, trophies, posters and memorabilia — a must for motorsport fans.

- Old Main Bridge: Classic viewpoints along the Main River, with scenes toward Marienberg Fortress.
- Marienberg Fortress (closed Mondays): The city's symbol

Bamberg – a UNESCO World Heritage city nicknamed 'Little Venice'.

- Little Venice: One of Bamberg's most famous attractions. Along the Regnitz River, you'll see rows of colorful houses creating a dreamy, Venice-like waterside view. You can choose to take an optional boat ride to experience the "Little Venice" charm up close—an unforgettable highlight of the trip.

Day 1 | Zurich → Biel → Bern → Interlaken (210 km)

In the morning, our driver-guide will meet you at the pre-arranged time and location to begin the journey.

Biel – a German/French bilingual lakeside city and a key hub of the global watch industry.

- Swatch Headquarters: Designed by Japanese architect Kengo Kuma; its cocoon/serpent-like exterior is a striking modern landmark.
- OMEGA Museum: Showcases the brand's history and watchmaking craftsmanship, Olympic timekeeping, Speedmaster's moon-landing legacy, and a James Bond (007) zone.

Bern – Switzerland's capital, famed for its UNESCO-listed medieval old town.

- Old Town: Stroll freely to admire well-preserved medieval buildings, distinctive arcades and fountains.
- Zytglogge (Clock Tower): Bern's iconic landmark. This centuries-old clock tower features a charming mechanical show a few minutes before each hour.
- Landmark fountains: Built in the 16th century to replace earlier wooden ones. Today 11 fountains are key sights, such as the Fountain of Justice, the Archer and Flag Bearer, and the Ogre Fountain.
- Bern Cathedral: Switzerland's tallest church, with magnificent Gothic architecture. Its 100-metre tower offers views over the Old Town and the surrounding Alps.
- Einstein House: During his time in Bern, Einstein completed work that changed the world - the theory of relativity. His former residence is now a museum.
- Rose Garden: On a hill opposite the Old Town, a beautiful park offering panoramic views of Bern's old city, the Aare River and the Federal Palace.
- Bear Park: The bear is Bern's symbol. This riverside park lets visitors observe brown bears living in a spacious environment.

Interlaken - between Lake Thun and Lake Brienz; blessed with spectacular nature and known as an adventure-sports town in Europe

Day 2 | Interlaken → Jungfrau (Top of Europe) → Leukerbad (100 km)

Jungfraujoch – the ‘Top of Europe’, set amid 4,000m-class peaks and listed as a UNESCO World Heritage site.

- Eiger Express + mountain railway (optional): Take the tri-cable gondola (~15 min) to Eiger Glacier Station, then connect by cogwheel train (~25 min) to Jungfraujoch.
- Sphinx Observatory Terrace: Around 3,571m, with 360° views of Jungfrau, Mönch, Eiger and the Aletsch Glacier.
- Ice Palace: A -3°C ice world carved by artists—ice tunnels and vivid sculptures (e.g., eagle, penguin, bear).
- Alpine Sensation: A multimedia experience linking the Sphinx Terrace and Ice Palace, celebrating the Jungfrau Railway’s history.

Leukerbad – Switzerland’s most famous alpine thermal resort, known since Roman times.

- Leukerbad Therme: The largest public thermal baths in the Swiss Alps (28–43°C) with indoor/outdoor pools, kids’ area, slides and sauna.
- Walliser Alpentherme & Spa: One of Europe’s largest wellness complexes, featuring Roman-Irish baths, multiple temperature/humidity zones, steam and thermal facilities.

Day 3 | Leukerbad → Saas-Fee → Locarno → Bellinzona (65 km)

Saas-Fee – the ‘Pearl of the Alps’, celebrated for glacier views, a clean car-free environment and year-round activities.

- Car-free village: Since 1952, fuel cars are banned; transport is mainly by small electric vehicles/horse carriages. In summer, enjoy hiking and possible marmot spotting.
- Mittelallalin Mountain - experience three “world’s” highlights:
- 1) World’s highest underground funicular/metro: Built entirely inside a glacier tunnel, taking you from Felskinn station up to 3,462 metres.
- 2) World’s highest revolving restaurant: A slowly rotating restaurant at the summit offering 360-degree views of 13 peaks over 4,000 metres while you dine.
- 3) World’s largest ice cave/glacier pavilion: A huge natural ice cavern revealing glacier interiors and featuring exquisite ice sculptures.

Locarno – mild climate and Mediterranean charm; host city of the Locarno International Film Festival.

- Piazza Grande: A lakeside pedestrian square lined with cafés and shops—main venue for film festival and major events.
- Madonna del Sasso Sanctuary (optional): Take the funicular to Orselina to visit the famous hilltop pilgrimage church.

Day 4 | Bellinzona → Schwyz(Stoos) → Lindt Home of Chocolate → Zurich (175 km)

Bellinzona – in the Italian-speaking region, a UNESCO World Heritage site renowned for its castles and southern flair.

- Castelgrande: The largest and oldest of Bellinzona’s three castles; take the elevator up for panoramic views. (Other castles: Montebello & Sasso Corbaro.)
- Old Town: Enjoy a relaxed walk and a taste of medieval atmosphere.

Schwyz – the origin of the German name ‘Schweiz’ and the English ‘Switzerland’; the Swiss flag’s white cross also traces back to the canton’s emblem.

Stoos – a charming alpine plateau resort, famous for its distinctive ‘barrel’ funicular.

- Stoos steep funicular (optional): Opened in 2017 and among the steepest funiculars in the world (~47.7°). Ride to the car-free village and the 360° viewpoint over lakes and alpine peaks.

Lindt Home of Chocolate (Kilchberg) – a modern, immersive chocolate experience.

- Chocolate Museum: Features one of the world’s tallest free-standing chocolate fountains, interactive exhibits and a chocolate-making workshop (advance booking required).

Arrive Zurich in the early evening. The driver-guide will see you off at the designated drop-off point. End of tour.

Day 1 | Prague → Karlovy Vary → Pilsen (210 km)

In the morning, our driver-guide will meet you at the pre-arranged time and location to **begin the journey!**

Karlovy Vary – the Czech Republic’s most famous spa town, known for its hot springs and elegant colonnades (UNESCO-listed).

- Unique “drinking spa” tradition: 13 main hot springs with different temperatures and mineral content, believed to have healing benefits.
- Mill Colonnade : It is the largest and oldest stone colonnade, built in a Neo-Renaissance style. The Market Colonnade is a delicate Swiss-wood pavilion with a fairytale ambience; plus Park Colonnade with the “Snake Spring”. Hot Spring Colonnade protects the hottest spring (up to 72°C), with a geyser jet reaching around 12 metres.

Pilsen – the birthplace of Pilsner lager and a European Capital of Culture, famous for its beer legacy.

- Republic Square: St. Bartholomew’s Cathedral (tower 102.6 m), Renaissance Town Hall and the modern Golden Fountains.
- Pilsen Historical Underground: a 13th-century labyrinth of cellars and tunnels (about 20 km) used for storage and water systems.
- Pilsner Brewery (Pilsner Urquell): learn the brewing process behind the world’s first golden lager (1842). Beer tasting: sample fresh unfiltered, unpasteurised beer in the historic cellars.

Day 2 | Pilsen → Hluboká nad Vltavou → České Budějovice (140 km)

Hluboká nad Vltavou – a hilltop gem often called the “Czech Windsor Castle”.

- Hluboká Castle: transformed into a romantic Neo-Gothic château inspired by Windsor Castle, with white façades, spires and intricate stonework. Interior highlights: lavish rooms (140+), fine wood carvings, elegant furnishings, art collections, tapestries and ceramics.

České Budějovice – home of the original Budweiser (Budvar), famous for its brewing history.

- Přemysl Otakar II Square: one of Europe's largest squares, surrounded by Gothic/Renaissance/Baroque architecture. Samson Fountain & Town Hall: key landmarks; nearby "Wandering Stone" legend (step on it late at night and you may get lost).
- Black Tower: a 16th-century Renaissance bell tower with panoramic city views.
- Budvar Brewery: tour the traditional brewing process and taste fresh beer in the cellars.

Day 3 | České Budějovice → Český Krumlov (45 km)

Český Krumlov – a storybook medieval town in Bohemia, UNESCO World Heritage listed.

- Český Krumlov Castle: Built in the 13th century, the castle blends Gothic, Renaissance, and Baroque architectural styles. The castle complex features multiple courtyards, museums, a Baroque garden, and the famous Painted Tower. From the tower, visitors can enjoy panoramic views of the town and the winding Vltava River. Nearby photo-worthy spots include the castle bears and the Cloak Bridge.
- Old Town: The Old Town sits on a peninsula embraced by the Vltava River. Latrán Street is the liveliest area, paved with narrow cobblestones and lined with charming shops, cafés, and restaurants. Popular local dining options include Švejk Restaurant and Restaurant Jelenka, known for authentic Czech classics and quality beer.
- Old Town Highlights: Concord Square is surrounded by colorful medieval buildings. St. Vitus Church, built in the early 14th century, combines Gothic and Baroque elements; a key highlight is its delicate ribbed vaulted ceiling. The Plague (Black Death) Monument was built in memory of the victims of the 1679–1680 plague outbreak that swept through Europe.
- Vltava River Scenery: A riverside walk along the Vltava is the soul of Český Krumlov. The river winds in an S-shape around the Old Town, creating a breathtaking natural landscape that adds charm and romance to this picturesque town. The S-shaped Vltava River embrace creates the town's most iconic scenery and romance.

Day 4 | Český Krumlov → Telč → Kutná Hora → Prague (315 km)

Telč – a fairytale Renaissance town, UNESCO World Heritage listed.

- Zacharias of Hradec Square: one of Europe's most beautiful squares, framed by ornate Renaissance & Baroque façades and arcades.
- Telč Château: a Renaissance château featuring rich décor, murals, period furniture and the Golden Hall.
- Ponds & lakes: man-made lakes encircle the town, originally built for defence—scenery like a painting.
- St. James Church: climb the tower for views over the town and countryside; notable Gothic altar carvings.

Kutná Hora – a former silver-mining powerhouse in medieval Bohemia, UNESCO World Heritage listed.

- Sedlec Ossuary (Bone Church): an extraordinary chapel decorated with the bones of 40,000–70,000 people.



- St. Barbara's Cathedral: miners' patron saint; famed for its flying buttresses and murals depicting miners' lives.
- Italian Court: once the Royal Mint and a temporary royal residence; learn about medieval coin production.
- Silver Museum & medieval mine (closed Mondays): explore

Day 1 | Madrid → Segovia → Valladolid (210 km)

In the morning, our driver-guide will meet you at the pre-arranged time and location to begin the journey.

Segovia – a historic city listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

- Roman Aqueduct: Segovia’s iconic landmark and an engineering marvel of ancient Rome, built around the late 1st to early 2nd century. The aqueduct brought water from the Frío River into the city; its towering granite arches have stood for nearly 2,000 years without mortar.
- Alcázar of Segovia: One of Spain’s most fairytale-like castles—often said to have inspired the castle in Disney’s *Snow White*. Originally a Roman fortification, it later served as a royal palace and state prison. Climb the Tower of Juan II for sweeping views over the city and surrounding valleys.
- Segovia Cathedral: Built in the 16th century and known as the “Lady of Cathedrals”. One of the last Gothic cathedrals constructed in Spain, featuring exquisite choir stalls, stained-glass windows and chapels.
- Segovia’s roast suckling pig: A signature local speciality. The century-old Mesón de Cándido is the most famous spot to try it, renowned for its theatrical carving tradition and notable guests.

Day 2 | Valladolid → Ribera del Duero (Wine Route) → Bilbao (330 km)

Ribera del Duero – often called Spain’s “Napa Valley”, celebrated for rich, aromatic red wines.

- Ribera del Duero Wine Route: A scenic route stretching roughly 115 km along both banks of the Duero River—ideal for experiencing Spanish wine culture, history and gastronomy. Many wineries (e.g., Bodegas Protos, PradoRey) offer guided tours and tastings (advance booking recommended). Local roast lamb pairs perfectly with the region’s wines.

Bilbao – transformed from an industrial port into a vibrant hub for contemporary art, culture and cuisine.

- Guggenheim Museum Bilbao: Designed by Frank Gehry, the museum itself is a landmark of deconstructivist architecture, clad in thousands of titanium panels. Inside are modern and contemporary artworks; outside are iconic installations such as the giant “Puppy” and Louise Bourgeois’ spider *Maman*.
- Casco Viejo (Old Town): Explore the “Seven Streets” district filled with boutiques, pintxos bars and restaurants. The central New Square is a great place to relax and sample local tapas.

Day 3 | Bilbao → San Juan de Gaztelugatxe → Getaria → San Sebastián → Pamplona (260 km)

San Juan de Gaztelugatxe – a dramatic islet connected by a stone bridge, famous as a filming location for *Game of Thrones*.

- Coastal cliff views & hermitage: Climb the 241 steps to the small hermitage on top for breathtaking ocean scenery. A local tradition is to ring the bell three times and make a wish.

Getaria – a charming fishing village known for its maritime heritage, coastline, cuisine and famous natives.

- Basque seafood kitchen: Known for fresh seafood such as baby squid and turbot. The harbour-side grills are perfect for authentic charcoal-grilled fish. Pair with local Txakoli white wine for a classic match.
- Balenciaga’s hometown: Birthplace of legendary fashion designer Cristóbal Balenciaga. Visit the Balenciaga Museum to learn about his works and creative legacy.

San Sebastián – renowned for its beautiful shell-shaped bay and one of Europe’s highest densities of Michelin-starred restaurants.

- La Concha Beach: A graceful arc of golden sand and a famous seaside promenade. Nearby you can also visit quieter Ondarreta Beach or surf-friendly Zurriola Beach.
- A paradise for food lovers: Book Michelin-star dining in advance, or go “pintxos hopping” in the Old Town—traditionally one signature pintxo and one drink per bar before moving to the next (Txakoli or Rioja are popular choices).

Day 4 | Pamplona → Olite (Erriberri) → Logroño → Madrid (450 km)

Pamplona – a medieval city famous for the San Fermín Running of the Bulls festival.

- San Fermín Festival: Held each year from July 6 (opening ceremony at 12:00) through July 14. The bull run takes place daily at 08:00.
- Hemingway’s footsteps: Ernest Hemingway featured the festival in *The Sun Also Rises*. You’ll find his statue in the city and many bars he once visited, including the well-known Café Iruña.

Olite – once the capital of the Kingdom of Navarre, famed for its magnificent royal palace.

- Royal Palace of Olite: A romantic, fairytale-like palace with towers and courtyards reflecting medieval royal life. Walk the ramparts for panoramic views over the town.
- Medieval Old Town: Stroll cobblestone lanes with remnants of ancient walls and a classic medieval street layout.

Logroño – a top Rioja wine region hub known for outstanding pintxos culture.

- Stone bridges over the Ebro: Including Puente de Piedra and Puente de Hierro—important crossings and a traditional entry route for pilgrims on the Camino de Santiago.
- Cathedral of Santa María de la Redonda: A key landmark and Camino stop, recognised by its twin Baroque towers.
- Calle Laurel: Logroño’s most famous food street lined with pintxos bars—try local favourites such as mushroom skewers with shrimp, grilled pork skewers and meatballs.

Day 1 | Barcelona → Tossa de Mar → Girona → Cadaqués (213 km)

In the morning, our driver-guide will meet you at the pre-arranged time and location to begin the journey.

Tossa de Mar – a charming Mediterranean seaside town and a favourite inspiration spot for artists.

- **Medieval Walls:** perched on cliffs, Tossa de Mar is the only town on the Catalan coast with fully preserved medieval city walls (12th century), offering dramatic views. Actress Ava Gardner filmed here; her statue stands in town.

Girona – a city layered with Roman, medieval and Arab heritage, and a key filming location for Game of Thrones.

- **Girona Cathedral:** a magnificent Gothic cathedral famed for the world's second-widest unsupported Gothic nave; its grand staircase appears in major Game of Thrones scenes.
- **City Walls Walkway:** stroll along Roman and medieval walls for panoramic views and unique photo spots over the old town.
- **Arab Baths:** a 12th-century Romanesque building inspired by Moorish bathhouse design; explore the cold, warm and hot rooms to experience ancient bathing culture.
- **Rambla de la Llibertat (Liberty Street):** one of the liveliest pedestrian streets, lined with cafés, shops and restaurants—great for a relaxed stroll.

Cadaqués – a postcard-perfect white fishing village that inspired artists including the Surrealist master Salvador Dalí.

- **Salvador Dalí House-Museum** (Port closed Mondays from Nov-Mar): Dalí

- Santa Maria Church: a 17th-century Baroque church on higher ground overlooking the bay and the white village.

Day 2 | Cadaqués → Figueres → Besalú → Rupit → Vic (150 km)

Figueres – birthplace of Salvador Dalí, known for its unique artistic atmosphere.

- Dalí Theatre-Museum: Figueres' most iconic landmark and Dalí's "largest artwork". The former theatre was transformed with giant egg sculptures on the façade; inside are paintings, sculptures and installations. Dalí's tomb lies beneath the stage. (Highly recommended to book tickets in advance on the official website.)
- Castell de Sant Ferran: a massive 18th-century military fortress—one of the largest in Europe—with wide-open viewpoints over the city.
- Plaça de l'Ajuntament / central promenade: stroll through the pedestrian area with shops, restaurants and cafés to feel local life.

Besalú – a well-preserved medieval town of cobblestone lanes, like an open-air museum.

- Besalú Old Bridge: the town's signature 12th-century Romanesque stone bridge spanning the Fluvià River, with seven arches; in medieval times, a toll was collected to cross.
- Jewish Quarter & Mikveh: discover Besalú's Jewish heritage—see traces of a 13th-century synagogue and a remarkably preserved ritual bath.

Rupit – a hidden medieval gem, famous for stone houses, wooden balconies and cobbled streets—like stepping back in time.

- Iconic Suspension Bridge: the main entrance is a swaying wooden bridge built in 1945; a symbol of the village (limited to 10 people at a time), adding a touch of adventure.
- Rustic Stone Houses: many date back to the 16th–17th centuries, with carved construction dates—full of old-world charm.
- Church of Sant Miquel: a Baroque church in the village centre; climb the bell tower for panoramic views.
- Salt de Sallent (Sallent Waterfall): surrounded by rugged cliffs and forests; admire the powerful cascade and gorge views from above.

Day 3 | Vic → Montserrat → Penedès (Cava sparkling wine region) (120 km)

Montserrat – a unique place of deep religious and cultural significance, famous for its saw-tooth mountain formations and the Benedictine monastery.

- Montserrat Monastery: founded in the 11th century and Catalonia's most important pilgrimage site, blending Gothic and Renaissance styles. The museum features works by El Greco, Dalí and Picasso. The world-famous boys' choir performs at set times (advance booking recommended; typically on break in July and around Christmas).
- Black Madonna (La Moreneta): venerated in the basilica. Pilgrims can enter the chamber behind the altar to pay respects and touch the orb in her hand for blessings.
- Funicular / viewpoint ride: ascend to higher viewpoints for sweeping views over the monastery and surrounding mountains. The route is known for steep gradients up to 65%, among Spain's steepest.

Day 4 | Penedès → Tarragona → Sitges → Barcelona (155 km)

Penedès – a mild-climate wine region famous worldwide for Cava sparkling wine.

- Cavas Codorníu Winery (optional visit): history dates back to 1551; in 1872 Josep Raventós Fatjó first used the traditional method (as in Champagne) to create Spanish sparkling wine, marking the beginning of Cava's history.

Tarragona – a seaside town combining Roman remains, medieval architecture and modern scenery; listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

- Devil's Bridge Aqueduct: a 1st-century Roman aqueduct built under Emperor Augustus to supply water to ancient Tarraco (today's Tarragona).
- Roman Archaeological Sites: Tarragona was the capital of Roman Hispania Citerior. Key remains include the amphitheatre, circus, defensive walls and archaeological promenade.

Sitges – a famous coastal resort known for golden beaches and a lively arts scene.

- City of Arts: since the late 19th century, modernist artist Santiago Rusiñol attracted many artists here, making Sitges a bohemian cultural hub.
- White houses & the 'pink' seaside church: traditional whitewashed buildings and the iconic Church of Sant Bartomeu i Santa Tecla are must-see photo spots.

Arrive in Barcelona in the early evening; the driver-guide will drop you off at the pre-arranged location.

Day 1 | Lisbon → Fatima (Marian Apparition Pilgrimage) (130 km)

In the morning, our driver-guide will meet you at the pre-arranged time and location to begin the journey.

Fátima – one of the world’s most important Catholic pilgrimage destinations, famous for the 1917 apparitions of the Virgin Mary to three shepherd children.

- **Basilica of Our Lady of the Rosary:** Built in 1928 to commemorate the 1917 apparitions; it houses the tombs of Francisco, Jacinta and Sister Lúcia.
- **Chapel of the Apparitions:** Built in 1919 on the exact site of the apparitions; a solemn shrine marking where the holm oak once stood.
- **Basilica of the Most Holy Trinity:** Consecrated in 2007; Portugal’s largest church, modern minimalist design, pillar-free interior and ~8,000 seats.
- **Interactive Museum – Fátima Miracle:** Multimedia exhibits recreating the events of 1917.
- **Aljustrel Village:** Visit the homes of the three shepherd children and learn about the origins of the Fátima story.
- **Valinhos:** A route the children walked daily; another reported apparition site with Stations of the Cross and memorials.

Day 2 | Fatima → Coimbra → Mealhada → Aveiro → Porto (225 km)

University of Coimbra – Portugal’s oldest university; its historic complex is a UNESCO World Heritage site.

- **Joanina Library:** A lavish Baroque library often ranked among the world’s most beautiful; holds ~60–70k volumes (16th–18th centuries) and famously uses bats to protect books from insects.

- Royal Palace & St. Michael's Chapel: Once a royal residence; admire the ornate chapel with azulejo tiles, Baroque organ and royal box.
- University Tower (Goat Tower): Climb for sweeping views over Coimbra and the Mondego River.

Mealhada – the 'capital' of Bairrada-style roast suckling pig, perfect for a classic Portuguese meal.

- Famous roast suckling pig restaurants: Pedro dos Leitões and Rei dos Leitões (local historic favorites). Pair with Bairrada sparkling wine for the classic combination.

Aveiro – known as the 'Venice of Portugal' for its canals and colorful boats.

Naples – famous for its rich history, arts and a legendary food scene.

- Sansevero Chapel: renowned for the sculpture “Veiled Christ”, where an exquisitely carved marble veil appears almost transparent.
- Santa Chiara Monastery: known for the colourful Majolica-tiled cloister and serene garden with orange trees—full of Mediterranean charm.

Tivoli – Villa d’Este (“Hundred Fountains”): famed for its gardens with 500+ spectacular fountains and waterfalls; a UNESCO World Heritage Site (inscribed 2001) and a filming location of Bruce Lee’s classic movie.

- Avenue of the Hundred Fountains: lined with hundreds of small fountains and sculptures featuring eagles, lilies and boat motifs—showcasing remarkable engineering and artistry.

- Oval Fountain: a masterpiece of late Renaissance water-garden design, mimicking natural landscapes with cascades flowing into a giant semi-oval basin for a dramatic visual impact.
- Dragon Fountain: four dragon sculptures spouting powerful jets, built to commemorate Pope Gregory XIII's visit (whose coat of arms features a dragon).
- Neptune Fountain: restored and enhanced in the 20th century; the Organ Fountain creates a roaring waterfall—an impressive fusion of art and engineering.

Day 1 | Zagreb → Varaždin → Slovenia – Maribor (166 km)

In the morning, our driver-guide will meet you at the pre-arranged time and location to begin the journey.

Varaždin – rich in heritage and arts, known as Croatia’s “Baroque architecture capital”.

- Varaždin Castle & Old Town: a signature landmark—once a medieval fortress, later rebuilt in Renaissance and Baroque styles. The castle houses a museum showcasing local history, culture and art.
- Cathedral of the Assumption: a Baroque cathedral renowned for its magnificent interior and ornate altars—an important local religious site.
- National Theatre: a grand Neo-Renaissance building and the city’s main venue for cultural performances.
- King Tomislav Square: surrounded by historic buildings such as the Town Hall, cathedral, palaces and academic buildings.

Maribor – known as the “city of the world’s oldest vine” and a former European Capital of Culture.

- Old Vine House: its façade is covered by the “world’s oldest vine” (Guinness-recognised, 400+ years). Learn about local wine history and taste Styrian wines.
- Lent District: the oldest and most charming quarter along the Drava River, featuring well-preserved medieval defensive towers such as the Water Tower and the Judgement Tower.
- Main Square: lined with colourful historic buildings. At the centre stands a Baroque plague memorial column.
- Maribor Castle (closed Mondays): a 15th-century

Day 2 | Maribor → Celje → Ljubljana (135 km)

Celje – known as Celeia in Roman times, once a prosperous settlement, famous for its impressive castle.

- Celje Castle: built in the 12th century. Though now in ruins, it still conveys its former glory. The best-preserved tower is Frederick's Tower, named after Frederick II of the Counts of Celje, who was imprisoned here during family power struggles. The hilltop location offers sweeping views of Celje, the Savinja River and surrounding mountains.
- Celje Regional Museum: one of Slovenia's largest regional museums, presenting Celje's history from Roman times to the modern era.
- Museum of Recent History: exhibits covering history from World War I to the present, including wartime and post-war life in Slovenia. The special "Children's Museum" is also worth a visit.
- Roman Ruins (beneath the Palace): an underground exhibition displaying preserved Roman streets, city gates and house remains—often dubbed the "second Troy" of the region.

Ljubljana – picturesque and leafy, crowned as the "European Green Capital".

- Ljubljana Castle: with around 900 years of history. Take the funicular from the Old Town to the castle courtyard (about 1 minute), then climb the panoramic tower for views over red rooftops, the winding Ljubljanica River and the Alps.
- Triple Bridge: a city icon connecting the Old Town and the modern centre—three bridges side by side, a masterpiece of architect Jože Plečnik.
- Dragon Bridge: spanning the Ljubljanica River and adorned with four vivid green dragon statues. The dragon symbolizes strength, courage and the city's guardian.
- Prešeren Square: surrounded by Baroque and Art Nouveau buildings and named after the national poet France Prešeren. His statue stands at the centre, symbolising Slovenia's cultural spirit. Across the square is a relief of his beloved Julija—facing him in a romantic, poetic dialogue.

Day 3 | Ljubljana → Lake Bled → Postojna Cave → Croatia – Opatija (227 km)

Lake Bled – famous for its island church and cliff-top medieval castle, a national symbol of Slovenia.

- Bled Island / Church of the Assumption: ride the traditional colourful Pletna boat (about 15 minutes, rowed standing up by the boatman) to the island. After landing, climb 99 stone steps to reach the church—one of Slovenia's most iconic sights. Legend says that ringing the 'wishing bell' three times will make your wish come true. Inside, admire the ornate Baroque gilded main altar depicting the seated Virgin Mary and the Child Jesus.

Postojna Cave (advance booking recommended) – one of Europe's largest karst cave systems, renowned for its spectacular underground scenery and cave-train experience.

- Cave Train: take a unique electric mini-train about 2 km into the cave, admiring early-stage stalactite formations along the way. This is the only show cave in the world with a double-track cave railway.
- Red/White Halls: the Red Hall's formations take on reddish tones due to iron and manganese during calcification. The White Hall remains pure white because no impurities entered the limestone.
- The cave's 'treasure': the Brilliant Pillar - about 5 metres tall, strikingly white - paired with a neighbouring column, resembling a bride and groom at a wedding.

- ‘Human fish’ (olm): a rare cave-dwelling creature with a pale body and slender limbs. Living in darkness, its eyes have regressed. It is Europe’s only cave-dwelling vertebrate.

Day 4 | Opatija → Rijeka → Zagreb (175 km)

Opatija – an elegant aristocratic seaside resort, often called the “Nice of the Adriatic”.

- Lungomare Promenade: a 12-km seaside walkway along the Adriatic, perfect for strolling with sea views and historic architecture.
- Maiden with the Seagull: the iconic statue standing on seaside rocks overlooking the bay—now a symbol of Opatija. It represents a blend of loyalty, longing and hope.

Rijeka – known for its port and maritime history, cultural heritage and modern vibe; selected as the 2020 European Capital of Culture.

- Trsat Castle: the city’s key historic landmark with panoramic views over Rijeka. The complex includes the Shrine of Our Lady of Trsat, an important pilgrimage site visited by Pope John Paul II in 2003.
- Korzo Street: the main pedestrian boulevard lined with Austro-Hungarian architecture, boutiques, cafés and restaurants—great for experiencing local life.
- Peek & Poke Computer Museum: a quirky retro computer and video game museum, popular with tech enthusiasts.

Odense is Denmark's third-largest city, famous as the hometown of the world-renowned fairy-tale writer Hans Christian Andersen.

- **H.C. Andersen's House:** Designed by Japanese architect Kengo Kuma, the museum blends fairy tales, literature and poetry, connecting the indoor spaces with the surrounding gardens. With modern interactive installations, lighting, sound and scenography, visitors can explore Andersen's creative universe and the deeper meaning behind his works.
- **Andersen's Childhood Home:** A small house on Munkemøllestræde Street where Andersen lived from age 2 to 14. The home preserves the simple living conditions of a poor family—tight space and basic furniture—offering insight into his hard childhood.
- **Old Town Quarter:** Stroll along cobblestone lanes lined with well-preserved half-timbered houses and lovely gardens. Experience the charm of medieval Denmark—like stepping into an Andersen fairy-tale scene.
- **The Funen Village:** A large open-air museum showcasing rural life on Funen Island in the 18th–19th centuries. It is not a functioning village; instead, around 30 original buildings from across Funen—farmhouses, workshops, windmills and watermills—were relocated here and reconstructed.

Day 2: Odense → Billund → LEGOLAND® (108 km)

Billund is one of Denmark's world-famous family destinations, known as the “LEGO wonder city.”

Day 3: Billund → Esbjerg → Ribe → Kolding → Vejle (180 km)

Esbjerg is a beautiful coastal town on the Jutland Peninsula, known for its scenic harbor, modern sculptures and natural landscapes.

- **Esbjerg Performing Arts Centre:** One of Denmark's key cultural venues, hosting 100+ events annually including concerts, theatre, stand-up, musicals and opera.

Fjordenhus: Located at Vejle Harbor and designed by Icelandic-Danish artist Olafur Eliasson. The building blurs the boundaries between art, sculpture and architecture. It features four distinctive cylindrical towers rising from the water (about 28 m tall), inspired by ancient castle walls and built with nearly one million handmade bricks.

Gourmet Art Experience: Michelin 1-star restaurant LYST, located inside Fjordenhus. The dining experience blends refined elegance with sensory flavors. Its philosophy emphasizes sustainability and carefully selected fresh ingredients, using seasonal produce sourced within 100 km to craft an approximately 20-course tasting menu.

Roskilde is one of Denmark’s oldest cities, famous for its Viking history and the large Roskilde music festival.

Roskilde Cathedral: Known for its distinctive Gothic red-brick architecture and as the royal burial church of Denmark. Listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1995. Since the 15th century, more than 40 Danish kings and queens have been buried here—one site with the largest collection of complete royal tombs in the world.

Viking Ship Museum: The main exhibits are five Viking ship remains discovered and salvaged from Roskilde Fjord in 1962. The ships were deliberately sunk about 1,000 years ago to block enemy invasions. Visitors can also watch craftsmen build Viking ship replicas using traditional methods such as axe-hewing oak—showcasing exceptional Viking shipbuilding skills.

- Mostraumen Fjord Cruise (seasonal, typically May–Sep, ~3 hours): sail through Osterfjord and narrow Mostraumen strait with dramatic mountain scenery.
- Bryggen Wharf (UNESCO): iconic wooden hanseatic buildings along the harbour—wander through narrow alleys with boutiques, studios and cafés.

Rjukan – known for WWII history, a UNESCO industrial heritage site, and its unique 'sun mirror' project.

- Krossobanen Cable Car (note): built in 1928; it has been out of service since 2021.
- Norwegian Industrial Workers Museum: linked to the famous WWII heavy-water sabotage; part of the UNESCO-listed industrial heritage area.
- Sun Mirror: a giant mirror installation that reflects winter sunlight into the town centre (best around midday in winter months).

Heddal – an important stop en route to Oslo, home to Norway's largest stave church.

- Heddal Stave Church: built in the 13th century; Norway's largest wooden church with remarkable medieval interior artefacts and traditional timber craftsmanship.

Drammen – a modern riverside city combining contemporary design, history and outdoor viewpoints.

- Drammen Spiral Tunnel: drive six loops inside a spiral tunnel to reach the mountain viewpoint (200 m) overlooking the town.
- Ypsilon Bridge: a striking cable-stayed bridge (opened 2008) named after the Greek letter 'Y', an award-winning design landmark.

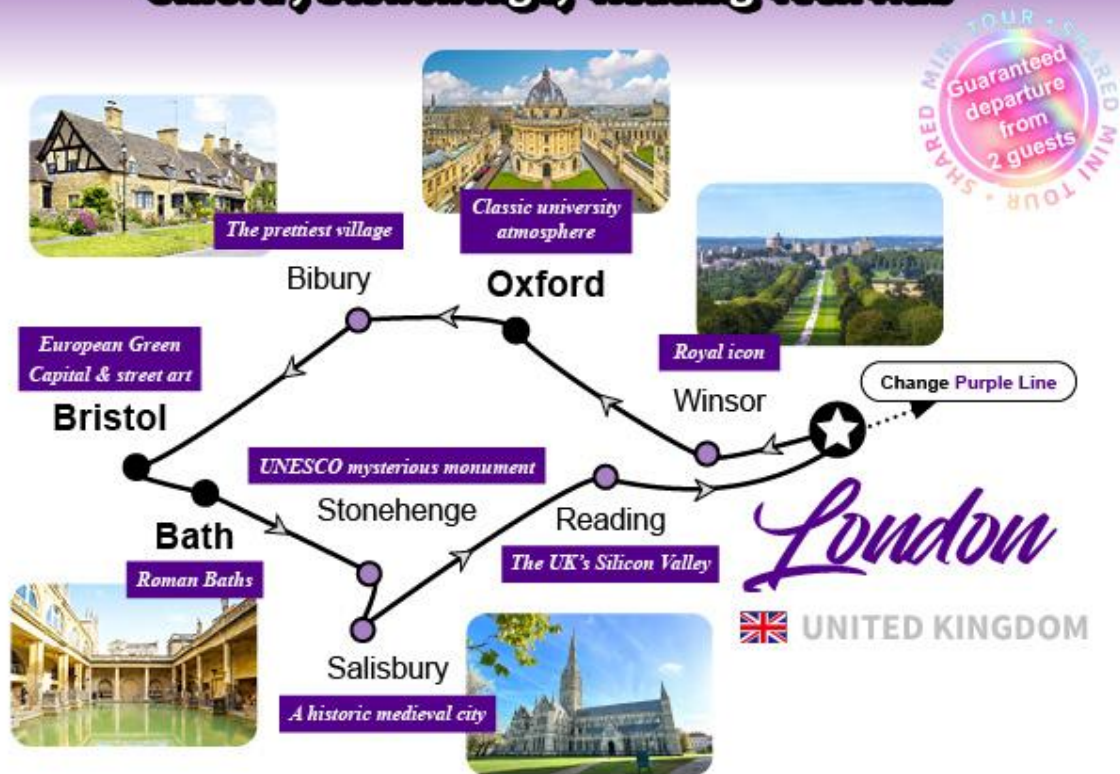

Day 1 | London → Windsor → Oxford (105 km)

In the morning, our driver-guide will meet you at the pre-arranged time and location to begin the journey.

Windsor – steeped in royal heritage, with charming historic streets and scenic Thames riverside views.

- Windsor Castle: one of the official royal residences and a symbol of the British monarchy.
- State Apartments: lavish ceremonial rooms used for state receptions, featuring masterpieces from the Royal Collection (including works attributed to Leonardo da Vinci).
- St George’s Chapel (closed Sundays):
- Windsor Great Park: a vast royal park (approx. 4,800 acres), once a private hunting ground and now a peaceful public green space.

Oxford – the UK’s oldest university city, famed for Oxford University and its iconic architecture (also featured in the Harry Potter films).

- University of Oxford: with over 900 years of history and alumni including 31 UK Prime Ministers and many Nobel laureates.
- Christ Church: the largest and wealthiest Oxford college; its Great Hall inspired Hogwarts’ dining hall and also functions as a cathedral.
- New College: founded in the 14th century, known for its beautiful courtyard and cloisters (also a film location).
- Bodleian Library: Oxford’s main research library, including Duke Humfrey’s Library and the Radcliffe Camera.
- Bridge of Sighs: Officially the Hertford Bridge, named because it resembles the famous Bridge of Sighs in Venice.

Day 2 | Oxford → Bibury → Bristol (132 km)

Bibury – often called “the most beautiful village in England”, beloved for its tranquil countryside charm.

- Arlington Row: a picturesque row of 14th-century weavers' cottages and one of the Cotswolds' most iconic scenes (also featured inside UK passports).
- River Coln & Rack Isle: a clear stream and meadow wetland area—great for spotting birds and occasionally otters.
- Bibury Trout Farm: founded in 1902, one of England's oldest trout farms—learn about fish farming or enjoy angling (seasonal).

Bristol – awarded “European Green Capital”, known for maritime heritage and an edgy street-art scene (Banksy’s hometown).

- Clifton Suspension Bridge: Bristol’s landmark engineering masterpiece and one of the best viewpoints over the Avon Gorge.
- SS Great Britain (closed Mondays):
- Harbourside: lively waterfront with cafés, restaurants, museums and creative spaces.
- Street Art Walk: discover early Banksy works and hidden murals across the city.
- St Nicholas Market: Bristol’s oldest market—food stalls, crafts, vintage finds and a vibrant local atmosphere.

Day 3 | Bristol → Bath → Stonehenge → Salisbury (105 km)

Bath – famed for Roman baths, natural hot springs and elegant Georgian architecture; the entire city is a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

- Roman Baths: dating back to around AD 70, built around a natural spring (water emerges at about 46°C).
- Museum & archaeology exhibits: explore Roman artefacts, sculptures and interactive displays about bathing culture and daily life.

Stonehenge – one of the world’s most mysterious prehistoric monuments and a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

- Construction period: Stonehenge was built in phases during the Late Neolithic, roughly completed between 4000 BC and 2000 BC. There are two main types of stones: larger sarsen sandstone and smaller bluestones. How these multi-ton megaliths were transported here thousands of years ago remains a mystery.
- Purpose mystery: The purpose of Stonehenge remains one of archaeology’s great puzzles. Mainstream theories suggest it served multiple functions rather than a single one—evolving from an early burial site into a complex place aligned with celestial events for calendar calculations, and a venue for large ceremonies and rituals. It is precisely this enduring mystery that makes Stonehenge an everlasting archaeological wonder.

Day 4 | Salisbury → Reading → London (158 km)

Salisbury – a historic medieval city and a gateway to Southern England’s cultural heritage.

- Salisbury Cathedral: famous for Britain’s tallest church spire (123 m). Inside you can see one of the oldest working mechanical clocks (c. 1386) and an exceptionally well-preserved Magna Carta copy (signed 1215).

Reading – a city blending heritage with modern tech energy, often dubbed “the UK’s Silicon Valley”.



- Global tech hub: many major international tech companies have UK HQs or key offices here (e.g., Microsoft, Oracle, Huawei, Nokia, Intel, Siemens)—great photo stops for modern architecture lovers
- History & culture: explore medieval abbey ruins and quiet Victorian gardens.
- Riverside nature: stroll along the Thames for peaceful scenery; nearby highlights include Caversham Court Gardens and the leafy University of Reading.

Dublin – the capital of the Republic of Ireland, famous for its friendly atmosphere, literary heritage and vibrant pub culture.

- Trinity College Dublin (exterior): Ireland's most prestigious classical university, known for its historic Old Library, bell tower, former cricket ground and iconic red-brick buildings.
- Guinness Storehouse (advance booking recommended): learn about the brewing process and enjoy a complimentary pint at the Gravity Bar with 360° city views.
- Dublin Castle (exterior): once the centre of British administration in Ireland; today a key historic complex and state venue.
- Temple Bar District: Dublin's best-known cultural and nightlife area with traditional pubs, live music, restaurants and weekend markets.

Day 2 | Dublin → Belfast (Northern Ireland) (166 km)

Belfast – the capital of Northern Ireland, famous as the birthplace of the Titanic and now a vibrant modern city rich in culture.

- Titanic Belfast: the city's signature attraction on the former shipyard site, telling the Titanic story from design and build to her tragic sinking through immersive exhibits.

- Ulster Museum (closed Mondays): located in the Botanic Gardens, showcasing Northern Ireland's history, natural science, art and archaeology.
- Harland & Wolff Cranes (Samson & Goliath): iconic yellow cranes symbolising Belfast's proud shipbuilding heritage.
- Peace Walls & Political Murals: powerful open-air history of the Troubles, especially around Falls Road and Shankill areas.

Day 3 | Belfast → Giant's Causeway → Sligo (293 km)

Dark Hedges – one of Northern Ireland's most iconic tree-lined avenues, where ancient beech trees form a mysterious tunnel-like landscape full of fairytale and cinematic atmosphere. It is also famous as a filming location for Game of Thrones, and is a classic photo stop to experience Northern Ireland's natural charm.

Giant's Causeway – Northern Ireland's most iconic natural wonder, a UNESCO World Heritage Site.

- Basalt Columns: around 40,000 interlocking basalt pillars, many in perfect hexagons, forming a dramatic "stairway" into the sea—created by ancient volcanic activity. Legend of Fionn mac Cumhail: local folklore says the Irish giant built the causeway to challenge a Scottish rival across the sea.

Sligo – a Wild Atlantic Way town known for dramatic coastal landscapes and its strong links to Nobel laureate W. B. Yeats.

- Yeats's Grave (Drumcliff Churchyard): final resting place of W. B. Yeats, with the famous epitaph on his headstone.
- Sligo Abbey: 13th-century Dominican abbey ruins with impressive carvings and cloister remains.
- Lissadell House (open Jun-Aug): a grand Georgian estate with historical links to Yeats and Irish cultural figures.
